## From our Chief Financial Officers (CFO)

### Dear Friends of LMSA-Northeast,

For the past year, we've had the pleasure of overseeing the finances of the Latino Medical Student Association-Northeast and working with the regional executive board, comprised of medical students from all over the northeast region. Like previous CFOs, our goal has been to continue expanding our organization's financial potential in order to further our mission of recruiting and supporting Latino medical students.

### Financial Highlights

LMSA-Northeast is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization that receives most of its funding through income gained from our annual LMSA-NE conference. Revenue is generated from registration, sponsorships, and exhibitor fees. In addition, individual sponsors & donors, medical colleges, and fundraisers help us support our scholarships, regional events, and workshops. This year, we organized the 47<sup>th</sup> Annual LMSA Northeast Regional Conference on February 9<sup>th</sup> 2020. Led by laudable efforts of our executive board, we expanded our fundraising efforts and raised over \$16,000 from sponsors, the highest amount ever for a regional conference. This increased funding enabled us to increase the number of scholarships that LMSA- Northeast will be awarding to our region's medical students starting next year.

### Operating Highlights

LMSA Northeast is overseen by an executive council who fulfill their duties on a completely volunteer basis. The executive council is comprised of medical students currently attending schools from New Hampshire to Maryland. We conduct a combination of in-person and virtual meetings throughout the year to address pending issues and goals for the organization. Two years ago, our House of Delegates approved the addition of the Chief Financial Officer- Elect position to our executive board, in order to ensure continuity of management of our organization's finances. As the current CFO position is a two-year appointment, the CFO-Elect spends the first year learning about the position and gaining experience before taking over for the outgoing CFO the following year. We have filled this position for the next fiscal year.

### Looking Ahead

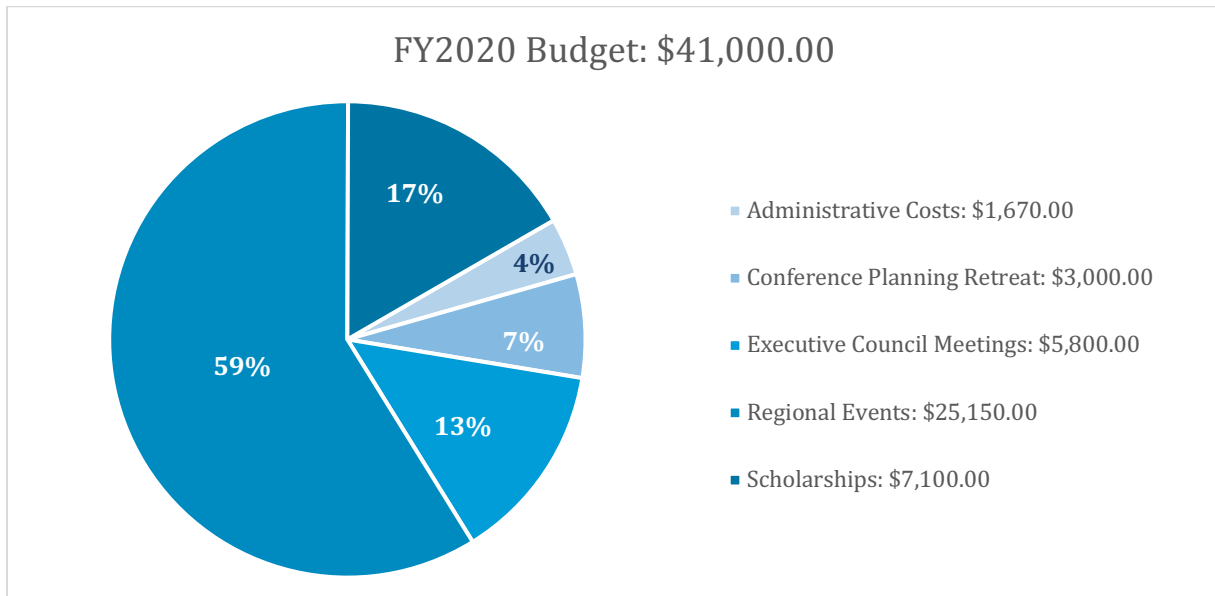

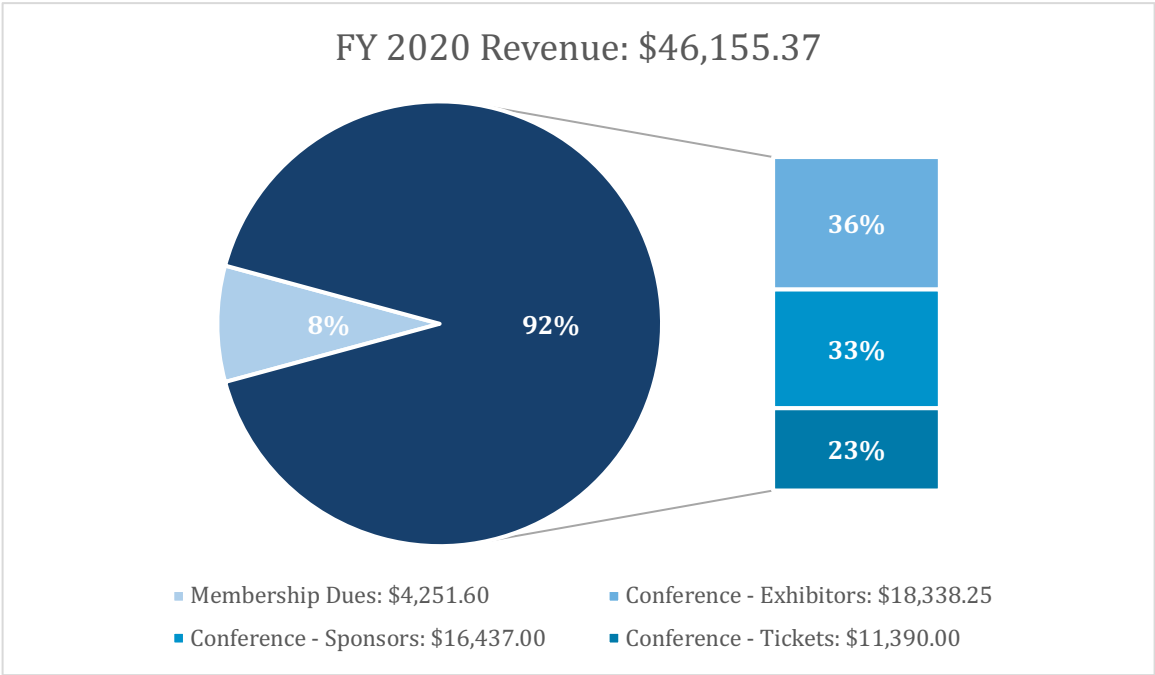

### DR. J. EMILIO CARRILLO AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH

The purpose of this fellowship is to foster excellence in research performed by members of the organization, and to establish an environment where students may discuss their work, have practice defending and presenting data, and establish relationships with leading Latino researchers. This is a unique opportunity to present your work at the regional level, and to receive input from nationally recognized researchers.

### DR. JAIME H. RIVERA-VELEZ AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING COMMUNITY SERVICE

This award serves to recognize and reward active LMSA-NE members for their participation in furthering the goals of the organization and for their time and dedication spent serving the Latino community. 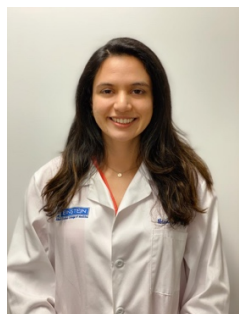

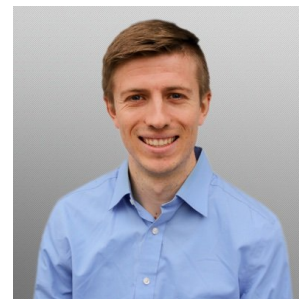
