This year was a continuation of our growth as both a regional organization and as a member of our overseeing association, LMSA National. Having celebrated just one year ago our 40th anniversary as the Latino Medical Student Association, formerly the Boricua Latino Health Organization, it was important to continue our efforts to expand in many different facets as a group including our membership and financial potential.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

LMSA-Northeast as a 501(c)3 non-profit organization receives much of its funding through income gained from the annual LMSA-NE regional conference including conference dues, sponsorship, and exhibitor fees. In addition individual sponsors, medical colleges, fundraisers, and individual donors help us support our scholarships, regional events, and workshops. Recently a new campaign was formed in 2012 known as the “40 for 40” campaign. In honor of our 40th anniversary several alumni pledged \$40 and began the campaign. We hope to reinvigorate the campaign as our communications and membership are expanding.

OPERATING HIGHLIGHTS

Currently LMSA Northeast is overseen by an executive council formed by current medical students attending schools located in the Northeast region. We conduct in-person meetings once a month to address pending issues and goals for the organization.

LOOKING AHEAD

This year as Treasurer my goal is assist in the expansion of membership including chapter and membership dues. Additionally I would like to reinstate the financial campaign as we begin to contact more alumni of our association. Also, I aim to begin applying for grants as an organization in order to expand as company and be able to cater to the needs of our chapters and their members.

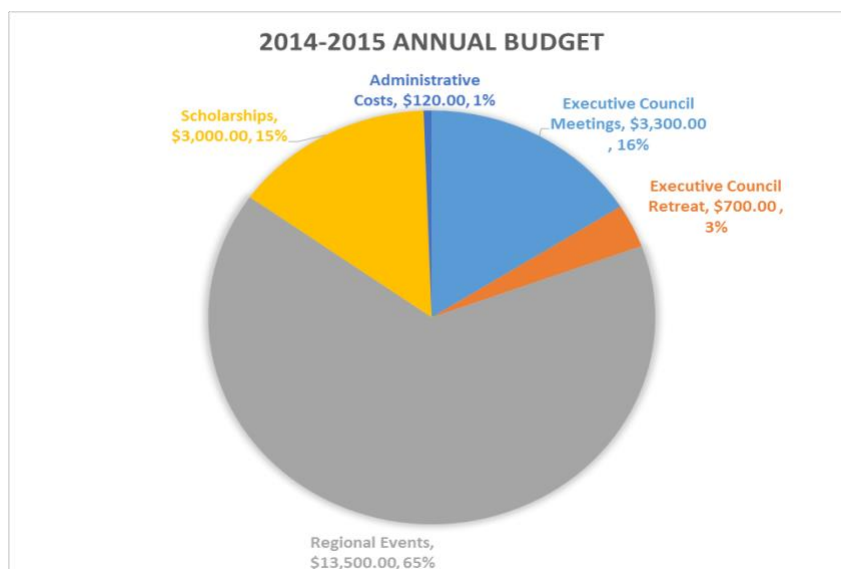
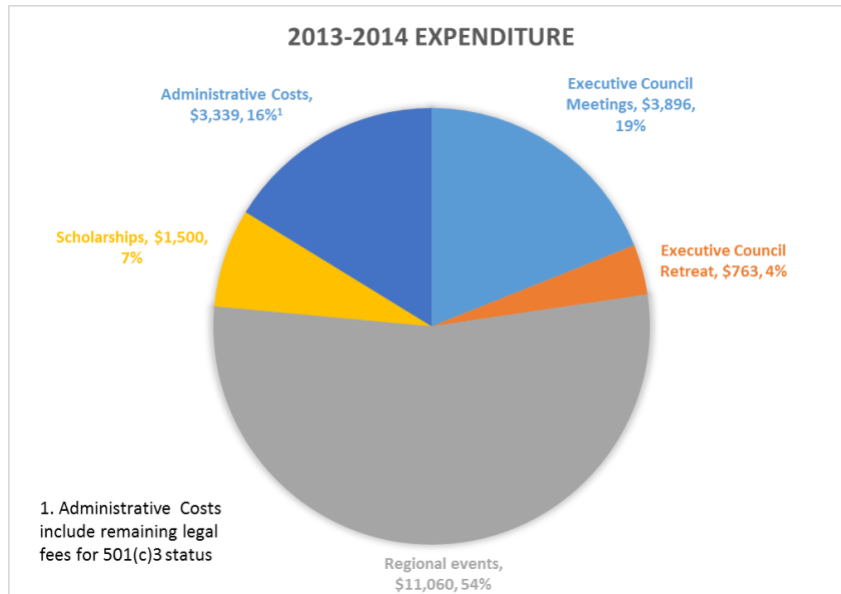

DR. J. EMILIO CARRILLO AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH

The purpose of this fellowship is to foster excellence in research performed by members of the organization, and to establish an environment where students may discuss their work, have practice defending and presenting data, and establish relationships with leading Latino researchers. This is a unique opportunity to present your work at the national level, and to receive input from nationally recognized researchers.

DR. JAIME H. RIVERA-VELEZ AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING COMMUNITY SERVICE

This award serves to recognize and reward active LMSA-NE members for their participation in furthering the goals of the organization and for their time and dedication spent serving the Latino community. In order to be eligible for this scholarship, you must be a paid, active LMSA-NE member with a demonstrated record of service to the Latino community. The scholarship is currently available only to medical students.

WOMEN'S HEALTH ADVOCACY AWARD

In honor of Dr. Jack Ludmir's dedication to serve and advocate for the rights of women, this award is meant to recognize efforts aimed at improving women's healthcare. This includes, but is not limited to, advocacy, research, education, and community service.

JOSEPH LOPEZ TRAVEL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD
